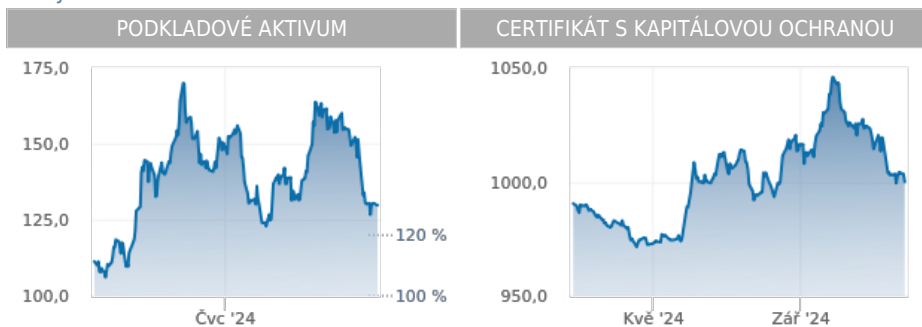

Issuer Risk:

As a bearer bond, a certificate is not subject to Austria's deposit protection.
